Dolkas/Mertz Award: The Awards Committee (Traci Bliss, Judy Jones, Reed Geisreiter, Joe Mikalak and Marla Novo) awarded \$2500 for an innovative approach to documenting the **History of the Tannery**. We are pleased to support ground-breaking research about such a significant place. The committee also awarded \$500 to the **Stan Stevens Emerging Historians Project**. *Stan loved local history and archives, and the MAH wants to honor him by cultivating this same passion in the students of Santa Cruz County. The project, in the very early stages, will include outcomes such as: downloadable lesson plans for teachers to bring into the classroom, field trips to the MAH archives and support that helps classes to complete local history projects.

Annual Gift to MAH: The MAH will soon complete the final touches on and installation of an informational Kiosk at Evergreen Cemetery's entrance. By combining two annual gifts (2021 and 2022) the History Forum has funded the entire project. We expect the Kiosk to be an inviting addition continuing major progress made in 2022. In October, *The Restoration of Evergreen Cemetery*, a short documentary made possible by the History Forum, received *The Spirit of Action* award from the Santa Cruz Film Festival (to view Google: Evergreen Restoration 2022). At the end of October, MAH held a ribbon-cutting ceremony celebrating the completion of the stunning ADA accessibility pathway. Robert Rittenhouse, one of the HF founding members in the 1990s and now in his 90s, says," What has been accomplished at Evergreen is truly spectacular."
